

Trey Gillenwater

In three seasons at Eastern Mennonite, Trey Gillenwater cemented his legacy as one of the top players to play at EMS. In just 68 career games, he scored 1,178 points, which ranks 6th in school history. His average of 17.2 points per game is 7th in the all time record books. Early in his career he was known for his 3 point shooting ability, shooting 37% from beyond the arc while playing at EMS. However, as he developed as a player, he became known in the area for his pull up jumper in the lane, and his unmatched ability to create points off the dribble. In his Senior year, his aggressive play earned him 102 trips to the free throw line where he shot an impressive 92%.

As a Senior Captain, Trey shot 52% from the floor, dropped in a career high of 42 points against Boys Home and scored 528 points during the season to help lead the Varsity Boys Basketball team to the VISAA DIII State Championship game. His 17 point second half performance sealed the Flames upset win of #1 ranked Fairfax Christian, 64 - 56. The Championship was the first in the history of the Boys Basketball program. To cap off his Senior Year, he was named to the VISAA DIII First team and State Co-Player of the Year.

Season accolades not only came from VISAA as Trey was a First-Team All Conference selection as a Senior in the Virginia Independent Conference. The VIC is one of the top basketball conferences in the state, and routinely sends athletes to top College programs around the country. Locally, Trey was named to the Daily News Record First Team his Junior and Senior years. With an average of 22 points over the course of two games, he was named the Broadway High School Tip-Off Tournament MVP. He was also named to the EMS Tip-Off Tournament all Tournament team as a Senior.

Trey will take his hard working style of play and sharp shooting ability to perennial ODAC contender, the University of Lynchburg.
