When on the court, there seemed to be nothing that Drew could not do to help the team. If they needed a defensive stop, he was locked in and could find the steal. If they needed a big three point shot, he could pull up and it would be nothing but net, if they needed a rebound, he would fly in and out jump everyone to bring down the board. This “do it all” mentality was on display during each of his 114 career games, which puts him at the top of the list for career games played.

Over his impressive career, Drew was relied on to play every position on the floor. His tenacity on defense caused fits for the opponent. It did not matter if he was matched up on the perimeter with a guard, or banging underneath with a forward or center, Drew never shied away from the challenge. Relying on his athleticism and ability to read the game, he grabbed 539 Defensive rebounds, and kept the possession alive with 159 Offensive rebounds. Collectively, the 701 rebounds puts him at the top of the EMS record books.

Not only was Drew a consistent rebounder, he was a relentless scorer with the ability to put points up in the paint, as well as hitting the three from outside. Over just his Junior and Senior seasons, he scored 1,088 points. His senior season he shot 51% from the field while scoring 570 points. His career total of 1,480 points puts him 4th overall in EMS history.

We can't talk about his EMS Basketball career without mentioning his 14 point, 5 rebound performance in the VISAA State Championship Game his Sophomore year when EMS captured their first Boys Basketball State Championship, upsetting Fairfax Christian 64-56. Drew played all 32 minutes in that game.

Within the Blue Ridge Athletic Conference, he was a 1st Team All-Conference selection his Junior and Senior seasons. At the state level he was a VISAA 2nd Team Selection his Junior year and a VISAA 1st team selection as a Senior. He was also named WHSV Student Athlete of the Week.

Drew was also a consistent golfer in the EMS Golf Program. His Sophomore year he was a key scorer helping secure the VISAA D3 Team State Championship for the Flames, a first in the golf program.
